

Quilt Block For Quilt Show Chair Judy O'Polka



Diamond in a Square 8 ½" unfinished Block Material - Civil War Reproduction Fabric

1. Cut: 1 - 6" Square for Center

Correction: on #2 -- It should read: Cut 2 - 5" Squares for Corner Triangles

- 2. Cut: 2 4" Squares for Corner Triangles.
- 3. Cut each 4" Square on the diagonal making a total of 4 corner triangles. Mark the mid-point of the long side of each triangle by folding in half and pinching the crease.
- 4. Mark the mid-point of each side of the center square in the same way.
- 5. Sew a triangle to one side of the square, taking care to match these mid-points. Note that the points of the triangle will project about ¹/₂" beyond the sides of the square. Turn back triangle and press. Trim away the points.
- 6. Sew the other 3 triangles to the remaining sides of the square in the same way to give a "square-on-point. This completes the block.
